Illinois Mandatory CLE Requirements

For all two-year reporting periods, attorneys subject to the MCLE Rules (who are not newly- admitted) must complete 30 total hours, including at least six hours of professional responsibility (PR). Newly-admitted attorneys must complete a course accredited as a Basic Skills Course or a mentoring program approved by the CoP (www.ilsccp.org) and at least nine other hours of Illinois-approved CLE credit, including any amount of professional responsibility (PR) credit.

Using the SVSA VA Accreditation Course for 3 Hours of MCLE in Illinois

This course has been approved by the Illinois MCLE Board for 3.00 Illinois MCLE general credit hours. Illinois is a self-reporting state in which the Illinois attorneys maintain their own records of MCLE compliance. Attorneys rely on certificates of attendance issued by the providers to report MCLE compliance to the Illinois MCLE Board. If you are an Illinois attorney, the Senior Veterans Service Alliance can provide a signed Illinois MCLE Certificate of Completion to you to receive the 3.00 available general credit hours.

To receive 3 hours of CLE credit in Illinois:

- 1. Finish the course and be certain to write down the three verification codes and the VA number announced during the course.
- 2. When finished with the course, go to www.CLEfeedback.com and submit our short evaluation form. In the box entitled 'Verification Codes' write the verification codes and the VA course number so we know that you have completed the course. in the box entitled 'State Bar Number' include your Illinois Bar number in this box. Illinois requires that we track our participants. You will not receive credit unless you submit these correct codes.

We **will not** submit your name to the Illinois CLE Commission as having completed our course until we receive the submitted evaluation form **with** the correct tracking numbers *and* Illinois bar number.

The SVSA is not responsible for any loss of credit due to the attorney's own decision to not complete or follow any of the instructions above.

Note: You are still responsible for mailing in your certificate of completion that is included with the course to the Department of Veterans Affairs to receive credit with them.
